<u>Drainage:</u> Chairman Mach adjourned the Board of Commissioners and convened the commission acting as the Drainage Board. The Drainage Administrator presented the following permits.

Permit DR2017-43 by William Sieverson, Owner for the NW1/4 of 19-119-48 (Vernon) The request, if granted, would improve crop production. The letters sent to downstream landowners have been acknowledged, the letter from the NRCS office has been received and the adjoining landowner's signature has been obtained. The applicant is seeking permission from the State to bore under Hwy 15 to outlet into the natural run on the adjoining landowner's land. Motion by Street and seconded by Stengel to approve DR2017-43 as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

Permit DR2017-44 by John Loeschke, Owner for the N1/2 of 2-119-48 and S ½ 35-120-48 (Alban). The request, if granted, would improve acres. The letters sent to downstream landowners have been acknowledged, the letter from the NRCS office has been received and the adjoining landowner's signature has been obtained. This project is a cooperative project with the adjoining landowners. The outlet is a 12" dual wall pipe. Motion by Street and seconded by Dummann to approve DR2017-44 as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

Permit DR2017-45 by Paul Nelson, Owner for the S1/2 NE1/4 ex Lt6 Paul & Lori Nelson Sub and including Lts 1&3 Paul & Lori Nelson Sub in SE 1/4 of 7-118-49 (Georgia). The

request, if granted, would improve productivity and make it easier to farm. The letters sent to downstream landowners have been acknowledged, the letter from the NRCS office has been received and the four adjoining landowner's signatures have been obtained as there are multiple outlets on their land. Motion by Street and seconded by Buttke to approve DR2017-45 as presented. Motion carried 5-0.

This concluded the business for the drainage board. Chairman Mach adjourned the Drainage Board and reconvened the Board of Commissioners.

Highway: A ROW occupancy application was presented by Jerry Zubke. The request is for a tile to be dug 10 feet deep in the ROW on 474th Ave in Section 4 of Grant Center Twp to allow the tile outlet to be placed in the natural run, the creek. Kathy Tyler spoke against approval of the permit request as only utilities should be allowed in the ROW and not be used for drainage purposes. Commissioner Stengel stated the Commission has allowed tile lines or pipes in other areas of the county under certain conditions. Supt Schultz stated the depth of the pipe would not interfere with road issues, but if the county did have a reconstruction project with the road, it would be the landowner's responsibility to move the pipe. Motion by Dummann and seconded by Stengel to approve the permit on the condition the landowner gives their written consent to do trenching through their yard. Motion carried 5-0.

Noted was the third quarter 911expenditures, revenues and statistics from the Watertown 911 Center. A notice was received from the PUC noting a public hearing will be held on December 13 at 6:30 PM at the Milbank High School Theater for public input on the application of Crowned Ridge Wind project. Holiday: The Commission noted information received that all State Offices will be closed on Friday, November 24 and Tuesday, December 26 per action of Governor Daugaard. As per the county policy to follow the state declared closings, the county offices will be closed on November 23 and 24 and December 25 and 26.

<u>Poet:</u> Chad Johnson, Poet Project Manager for the rail line spur by Northern Lights, joined the meeting by teleconference. A discussion was held on a building permit for the project. Due to a miscommunication a building permit was not obtained. Chad Johnson stated the cost of the permit was not built into the total project cost and he would need to talk to the board of directors at Northern Lights and Poet about the additional cost. He will contact the auditor after he talks with the board of directors.

Budget Supplement: The budget supplement hearing was held with no members of the public present. The purpose of the budget supplement of \$100,000 is to adopt budget authority for the change to budget #153 for Court Appointed due to additional expenses of a trial. The county is a member of the Catastrophic Legal Expense Fund through the Commissioners Association, but reimbursement will not be received under 2018.
