

Natural Resources Opportunities for Youth...

Youth interested in natural resources, rangeland and soils, there are several opportunities for you to gain knowledge in these specific areas.

The South Dakota State University Department of Natural Resource Management will host the 2017 Natural Resource Camp at the Oak Lake Field Station in Astoria, SD, on July 10-14.

Students have the opportunity to gain exposure to the world of natural resources through hands-on experiences in natural resource ecology and management. High school students entering grades 9-12 who have a strong desire to learn more about the natural world or who have an interest in pursuing a career related to natural resources are encouraged to attend.

A wide range of unique activities will

be offered at the camp. Camp attendees will have opportunities to assist with capture and sampling of birds, fish, aquatic invertebrates and mammals. Students also have the opportunity to learn about search and rescue tracking, stream ecology, plant diversity and much more.

SDSU Extension will host the 2017 South Dakota Professionals & Youth Range Camp June 7-9, 2017 at the Lamphere Campground and Meade County School east of Sturgis, SD.

The Professionals Range Camp will educate agricultural professionals, including but not limited to agricultural lenders, appraisers, assessors, realtors, educators, and government agencies. Participants will learn how to determine the

economic potential of rangeland, as well as production and conservation practices to improve and sustain this resource.

Cost of registration is \$150. The Youth Range Camp is for youth ages 14-18 with an interest in understanding rangeland ecosystems and suitability for livestock and wildlife. Cost of registration is \$85.

SDSU Extension will host South Dakota Rangeland & Soils Days June 20-21, 2017.

This event provides an opportunity to learn about the natural resources of rangeland and soils. Learning activities for a variety of ages (8+) and expertise will be available.

Attention: 4-H Animal Updates

Spring is here and animal paperwork will be quickly picking up. This article will outline changes and new processes this year related to 4-H animals.

Rodeo

The official Rodeo packet is now available on <u>iGrow</u>. The entry process is due May 1st!

To highlight important steps: members must enroll on 4H Online, complete required paper work and mail the proper paperwork to the 4-H Rodeo Finals Secretary. The office will only receive the Insurance Declaration Form I. This process is new so take time to review the entry process.

Horse

4-H members planning on participating in the 4-H Horse Show, start making plans before our first horse safety opportunity. Each youth during horse safety training, must complete two skill sets and a youthin-action. Plan to give a demonstration at your club about your horse.

This year's horse safety training is about horsemanship. Horse safety training will be held on May 7, in conjunction with the Hairy Horse Fun Show.

Ownership Affidavits, DNA & Registration Papers

4-H Ownership Verification Affidavits are available on iGrow. If you are 4-H members are planning on showing animals at Achievement Days and SD State Fair, these must be <u>FULLY</u> <u>completed</u>. The Grant County 4-H program adheres to the South Dakota 4-H deadlines. **NO forms will be** accepted unless completely filled out. To access affidavit forms, visit https://sdsu.box.com/v/animalova.

YPQA+ Training

Youth planning to exhibit Market Swine in the 4-H division at the Grant County Achievement Day and South State Fair, must complete the YPQA+ training, not the YQCA training. Grant County will be holding their training Thursday, May 25.

Deadlines:

June I—Market Beef (Please notice change of date).

June I—Breeding beef, breeding meat goat, breeding sheep, dairy cattle, dairy goat, market goat, market sheep, market swine, poultry and rabbit.

A friendly reminder that there is a DNA sample process for all market animals intended for the 4-H division competitions at the South Dakota State Fair. DNA samples will cost exhibitors \$6 per animal at the time of their initial weigh in. DNA samples must be on file or before the Ownership Affidavit deadline.

Beef

Breeding Beef animals will be required to have something more tangible than a herd tag for commercial animals. Breeding beef will need a tattoo at verification time of a NUES Green Tag.

Youth unable to make weigh-in March 19 will need to have their Market Beef animal identified by May 31.

Sheep & Goat

Another important part of the NUES tagging system is that only one federal tag can be placed in animal. This becomes problematic with sheep and goats that already carry a Scrapie Tag (which is also a federal tag). Because of this, we will move away from green tagging sheep and goats. Sheep and goats still need to be verified on the Ownership Verification Affidavit forms, going forward their Scrapie number is the unique identifier. This change requires the entire Scrapie number be recorded on the form including the state code.

Market sheep and meat goat weigh in will be Wednesday, May 31 at 5:30-6:30 p.m. at the Grant County 4-H Grounds.

NOTE: Meat Goats do not need to be weighed in unless if you want to participate in the county 4-H Rate of Gain; therefore, families can self-identify their meat goat animals. DNA due June 1st, or within one week of receiving the animal.

Dairy

Families exhibiting 4-H Dairy Cattle will be required to provide one type of ID when submitting forms:

- A registration tag
- A registration tattoo
- An Electronic Identification Device (EID) tag number
- A complete Bangs tag number or a 4-H Green Tag number.

Swine

Families exhibiting swine will once again self-identify their animals. Ear tags, DNA and information will be available for families by Wednesday, May 3.

If families utilize an RFID tag or Premise ID, that is an acceptable tag for identification and can be used as a NUES green tag.

Poultry

Families exhibiting poultry will be issued leg bands when Ownership Affidavits are turned in. Legs bands must be on the animals when they arrive to Achievement Days.

Cat & Dog

Members who are planning to exhibit animals in the cat or dog project area, will be required to enter their animal information on 4H Online.

The information that needs to be entered is the animal name, sex, breed, colors and markings, age and vaccinations. A veterinary certificate for dog will be required at the first practice or the show, which event comes first. This will assist with Achievement Day entry.

Let's Start Cooking: Special Foods Follow Up

Grant County 4-H members attended the 4-H Special Foods Workshop on April 17. It allowed our current 4-H Special Foods participants give a synopsis of what the Special Foods Youth-in-Action event is about. They were pleased with the number of youth that participate in the workshop.

Therefore, the 4-H Office is creating a process for thos interested in Special Foods Youth-in-Action that does not look daunting. We will be sending a series of follow up update

emails to assist you with the process. We actually completed one part at the workshop as each youth received their MyPlate dietary guidelines specific to them.

The next step we would like you to do is find a recipe. Please make a note for beginners and first times, consider finding a smoothie recipe. A smoothie recipe is not complex but still showcase the basics of Special Foods. If you are junior and first timer, consider a recipe that is not complex like a fruit salad or

quesadilla. You can find recipes online, cookbooks, or magazines. Please turn in your recipe to the 4-H Office by May 15. Before you turn in your recipe, please utilize your MyPlate dietary guidelines to figure out what food group area your recipe falls under.

HOSTA for Youth Farm & Ranch Workers

SDSU Extension will be conducting two Hazardous Occupations Safety Training for Agriculture courses May 25 - 26, 2017 in Philip and May 31-June 1, 2017 in Mitchell.

Youth planning to work on a farm or ranch this summer are encouraged to attend. "If youth are 14 or 15 and working on a farm or ranch that is not their families they are required by law to attend a training," said John Keimig, SDSU Extension 4-H Associate. "Because agriculture work can be dangerous, we encourage all youth who plan to engage in agriculture work to attend the training."

The trainings will be held from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on the first day at both locations and 9 a.m. until 1 p.m. the second day. Registration is required.

A test will be held the second day, those passing the test will receive certification. The written exam covers 48 core task sheets. The test must be passed with a minimum of 70 percent in order for the participant to advance to the driving portion of the training. Those under 14 can also attend but will not be able to take the written or driving test.

The Philip course will be held at the American Legion Hall (West Main Street) and the Mitchell event will be held at the Davison County Fairgrounds (3200 W Havens Ave).

Attend Because It's the Law

"The agricultural industry is the only industry in the U.S. that allows youth

under the age of 16 to be legal employees," Keimig said. "The HOSTA programs aims to help teach those young employees about the dangers associated with working on the farm and ranch."

Since 1969, the United States
Department of Labor has declared
many agricultural tasks to be
hazardous to youth younger than 16.

Currently, the law states that any individual who is 14 to 15 years old must be trained on the safe operation of tractors, farm machinery and other hazardous activities in the agricultural industry.

"One exception to the rule is youth who are employed on their home farm," Keimig explained. "When youth reach 16 years of age this law no longer applies to their employment."

While not required to work on the family farm, Keimig encouraged all youth who plan to engage in agriculture work this summer to attend.

Program details

The National Safe Tractor and Machinery Operation Program is a project the United States Department of Agriculture Research, Education and Extension Service's Hazardous Operations Safety Training for Agriculture (HOSTA) Program.

HOSTA was developed to respond to the need for resources to inform and support the Youth Farm Safety



Education and Certification Regulation which is administered by the U.S. Department of Labor.

The training consists of independent study as well as hands-on participation and classroom instruction. Independent study materials will be sent to 14-18 year-old participants.

SDSU Extension personnel will be coordinating the training.

Register before May 19

To register visit, the iGrow Events page and search by event date. To cover the cost of participation and materials, there is a \$50 fee for the Phillip training and a \$60 fee for the Mitchell training.

Registration ends on May 19 for Phillip and on May 23 for Mitchell.

Upon registration, participants will be sent a training manual. This will also include a list of the information that the students will be responsible for before arriving on site as part of the independent study portion of training.


