#### Financial Assistance for Youth

Many of our youth participated in summer 4-H conferences and camps. Our 4-H program prides on providing educational opportunities for all our 4-H youth. However, there may be times when youth need financial support to attend these activities. There are two great financial scholarships from our county 4-H Leaders and the SD State 4-H Leaders Association.

A form must be completed by the 4-H member and turned into the correct organization.

The SD 4-H Leader's Association provides a \$25 scholarship available for 4-H members who attend Camp Poinsett or Bob

Marshall. There is a \$50 scholarship available for 4-H members who attend TLC, Performing Arts or Livestock Judging.

Youth need to complete the camp assistance/scholarship application form with all signatures and submit to the SD 4-H Leaders. You will receive your scholarship money within 2 weeks of its receipt.

#### **End of 4-H Year Information**

Congratulations on a wonderful 2018-2019 4-H year! On September 30, we will be closing out the 4-H year. There are many details to finish before that date comes around. We want to guide you to successfully completing your 4-H year. All 4-H Record Books and applications are due to the 4-H Office by Friday, September 30. Please use the checklist below to help you complete these steps.

4-H Record Book **completed?** The primary purposes of completing a 4-H Record Book are for youth to develop the skills necessary to setting goals, working toward achieving those goals, reflecting on his/her experiences, and setting new and high goals for themselves. Youth ages 8 to 18 are required to complete a 4-H Record Book as part of their participation requirements. Cloverbuds do not need to complete the 4-H Record Book process.

Record Books are judged for neatness and completeness. Members must include all the appropriate forms. They should have a project record for year projects they are enrolled in and project worksheets where appropriate. Youth should set realistic goals for themselves and have them talk about what they did and learned while working toward those goals.

- ⇒ The 4-H Office has green 4-H Record Book covers for purchase of \$3.00.
- ⇒ NOTE: There is only one slight change to the 4-H Record Book, which would be the animal financial form. We expanded the learning experience in the feed and labor portion.
- County Pin Awards? We recognize members who have been enrolled and completed 4-H for three years and completed project proficiency through various project areas. Youth must complete participation requirements,

- followed by enrolled and completed two years in project area and must show project accomplishments.
- ⇒ To receive project pins, youth must complete a County Pin award form for each project they wish to be rewarded.
- Other Award Applications? The Grant County 4-H program offers a variety of awards. Youth may have the opportunity to submit applications for Citizenship Washington Focus Trip, South Dakota 4-H Key Award, Grant County 4-H Livestock Award, Outstanding Beginner Award, Diane Frevert Memorial Award, Kay Wolff Youth-in-Action Award & 4-H Leaders Scholarship.

#### Prepare for National 4-H Week

The anticipation is building for National 4-H Week, during which millions of youth, parents, volunteers and alumni across the country will be celebrating everything 4-H. Grant County 4-H will observe National 4-H Week this year by showcasing the incredible experiences that 4-H offers young people, and will highlight the remarkable 4-H youth in our community who work each day to make a positive impact on those around them.

The theme of this year's National 4-H Week is *Inspire Kids to Do*, which highlights how 4-H encourages kids to take part in hands-on learning experiences in areas such

as health, science, agriculture and civic engagement. The positive environment provided by 4-H mentors ensures that kids in every county and parish in the country—from urban neighborhoods to suburban schoolyards to rural farming communities—are encouraged to take on proactive leadership roles and are empowered with the skills to lead in life and career.

One of the most anticipated events of National 4-H Week every year is 4-H National Youth Science Day, which sees hundreds of thousands of youth across the nation taking part in the world's largest youth-led STEM challenge.



The exciting theme for this year's challenge is *Game Changers*, which will run throughout October.

Developed by Google and West Virginia University Extension
Service, *Game Changers* will teach kids coding skills through fun exercises including gaming, puzzles and physical activity.

Partnerships with schools have already started in providing NYSD event.

#### What's Your BIG Idea?

The BIG Idea Competition is full swing into its 2019 BIG Idea Competition. High school students across South Dakota are invited to compete in this business idea competition, and winners will compete for over \$25,000 in cash prizes and scholarships. The optional Marketing Design competition allows students to submit an ad for their idea and to compete for additional prize money. Again, this year is a Wellness Category sponsored by Sanford Health that awards an additional \$500 to the

best business idea addressing wellness; plus a Food Animal Agriculture Category sponsored by Midwest Ag Supply that awards an additional \$500 to the best business idea addressing food animal agriculture. **NEW** this year is an Agriculture Innovation Category sponsored by the South Dakota Agriculture Foundation that awards an additional \$500 to the best business idea addressing agriculture innovation.

Students may work individually or as

a team and will be able to submit their business idea applications online, due October 31<sup>st</sup>. The online application as well as various resources and examples can be accessed at the BIG Idea website: www.BIGIdeaSD.com.

All applications submitted by October 31<sup>st</sup> will be reviewed and ranked by several judges from the business community. The eight top scoring applications will be invited to the final competition which will be on December 11th at Northern State University.
