COMPLETING YOUR 4-H BOOK

It is suggested that your 4-H Record Book be in an expandable 4-H Book cover. These can be purchased at the 4-H Office for \$4.00 each. You may also use a three-ring binder. <u>Previous year records should remain in</u> your book; put your current year record on the top. After your green binder is full, please move oldest records to a 3-ring binder or purchase another green folder. Keep your records in order with the newest year on top.

MUST include the following in this order:

- 1.____ Introduction Page with picture of yourself
- 2. Calendar of Meetings/Event participated in
- 3._____4-H Accomplishments
- 4. ____ Project Sheet & Livestock Financial Forms for each enrolled project, in alphabetical order
- 5. My 4-H Story (Remember, 4-Her and a parent must sign!)

6._____ Pictures and newspaper clippings relating <u>only</u> to your 4-H year. (Please include Community Service and project area photos!)

- Don't forget to include the Recognition Event article from the previous year! This can be obtained from the 4-H Office!
- <u>Underline</u> your name in the newspaper clippings.

Things to Remember:

- Include a picture of yourself on the front page.
- This is a record of your 4-H year; shows 4-H and project completion.
- Set goals early and complete your Calendar of Events as you go.
- Apply for Recognition awards by September 30th. The following awards have separate applications:
 - Kay Wolff Youth in Action
 - Livestock Award
 - Pat Seehafer Memorial
 - Top Horseman
 - Leader's Scholarship
 - Twin Brooks Threshing Show Crop Award
